This manual includes instructions for packing Ditty Bags and packing gifts. An additional manual is included with optional patterns for knitting and sewing.

## Christmas at Sea Mission Statement

## Do's and Don'ts for Christmas at Sea

Listed below are things to remember in preparing gifts for Christmas at Sea:

### Do's for gifts:

- ☞ See list on the next page as a guideline for gifts. It's nice to have a number of items in one gift: toiletries, wrapped hard candy, a *game* type article, a cap, etc.
- ☞ Use directions for knitting hats and socks. Seafarers especially appreciate the watch caps and helmets.
- ☞ Use patterns for mending kits and ditty bags. Consider making ditty bags for packing the gifts. They are easy to handle and are reusable by the seafarer.
- ☞ **All gifts must reach us by October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2007. Packing Day is Tuesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Volunteers will gather on that day to pack the gifts. We will not be able to use or store gifts received after that date.**
- ☞ Place gifts inside Ditty Bags. Write their contents on a *post it*. Enclose a personal Christmas Card. Include your name and address. If you receive a letter of thanks please share it with us. We will print it in next year's manual.

### Don't for gifts:

- ☞ **Do not wrap gifts.** All gifts not already in Ditty Bags will be placed in Ditty Bags. Unwrapped gifts are easier for us to pack.
- ☞ **Do not give gifts for women seafarers.** Most women seafarers work on cruise ships which come in the summer. We see, one or two women seafarers during Christmas.
- ☞ **Do not send hotel toiletries. Do not send used items.** Remember, we want these gifts to show our love for Christ. We should not give leftovers as Christmas gifts.
- ☞ **Do not use or send giant sized toiletries.** Gifts have to be carried a long distance to a ship and the weight makes it difficult.
- ☞ **Do not put magazines in the gifts.** We give magazines year round to all ships. We include biblical literature and prayers with all the gifts.

Writing Paper and Envelopes

Warm Socks

Sewing Kits (buttons, thread and needle.) Use pattern available on our website at [www.seafarersministry.com](http://www.seafarersministry.com) or place items in a small medicine bottle or a film container.

Knitted Caps

Any similar items that would be appropriate. **No used items please!**

**A Ditty Bag of gifts should have a value of at least \$5.00 and include toiletries, an item of clothing, a *game or toy* suitable for an adult, candy, sewing kit and one or two other items from above. **Please do not put more than one heavy item in one ditty bag. We carry 25 bags on the ship at one time.****
